CAMPING REGULATIONS

1. Contact a member of the Camping Committee no later than 24 hrs prior for a verbal authorization.
2. A committee member will deliver a Permit during your stay
3. The maximum stay for each camping permit is 2 weeks (14 Days). All camping gear will be removed at the end of each camping trip.
4. Site locations as well as the size of RV's, Trailers and Tents is at the discretion of the Camping Committee and the Board of Directors.
5. Camping is not permitted along the Denwood property line.
6. Camping & Fire permits are limited to Club members. EXCEPTION: During special events, shooting non-members and their families are welcomed and are subject to all Club rules.
7. Club rules along with Federal, State and Town laws must be obeyed at all times.
8. Permit holders are responsible for family members and guests who are camping with them. Pets must be kept with the campsite. Dogs must be leashed when walking with their owners on club grounds.
9. Campsites are inspected after each camping group has left. Campers are asked to keep their sites clean. Permit holders whose group leaves glass, cans, snap or bottle tops in firepits or on the grounds in or around their sites will be reported to the Board or Directors. This includes cigarette and cigar butts discarded at random. Filter tips DO NOT BIADGRADE.
10. Cutting of live trees, clearing brush or changing the landscape in any way is not permitted.
11. Outside bathrooms are available during warm weather.
12. It is **PROHIBITED** to connect into the Club water or electrical services.
13. Open campfires are subject to daily weather conditions. No open campfires without a Fire permit. All fires are to be kept small and contained and a full water bucket is to be kept near each fire. NO BONDFIRES PLEASE! Never leave your fires unattended.
14. A **MANDATORY** noise curfew is in effect from 10PM to 8AM. Let's be considerate of our neighbors.
15. Please leave your sites as you found them.

Permits can be revoked at any time by the Camping Committee and/or the BOD. Violators of the regulations will be reported to the BOD for disciplinary action which could include expulsion from the Club.

PRIMITIVE AREA CAMPSITES REGULATIONS

This area is located north of the Trap Range and is a Registered Historical Site. It is where a Shingle Mill was built in 1760. The Circle and Fire Pit are sacred to local Indian tribes. Modern camping is not permitted in this area. Campers are cautioned to take great care while using this area, so that no damage is done to trees, shrubs, stone works, landscape and all waterways.

1. There are approx. 10 primitive campsites available outside of the split rail fence.
2. During daylight hours, this site is usually open to the public and is an active firing range. **No alcohol** is permitted during daylight hours.
3. One small campfire per site is allowed for cooking and heat. A **full** water bucket must be stationed by each fire at all times.
4. Campsites must be left clean. **You take out what you bring in.** **Leave nothing but footprints.**
5. Each camper will be issued a Camping & Fire Permit.
6. Loaded firearms are allowed only on designated ranges and not allowed in the camping areas.
7. Vehicles are allowed into this area for unloaded and loading only. **ONE HOUR MAXIMUM.** No vehicles will be allowed into this area after sunset.

Any problems shall be directed to the Camping Committee and/or the Blackpowder Committee, BOD or the Club President for determination.

These regulations apply to scheduled shooting events. Otherwise Club Camping Regulations are in effect.

Violators of the Primitive and/or Club Camping Regulations will be reported to the BOD (Board of Directors) for disciplinary action, which could include **EXPULSION** from the Club.
